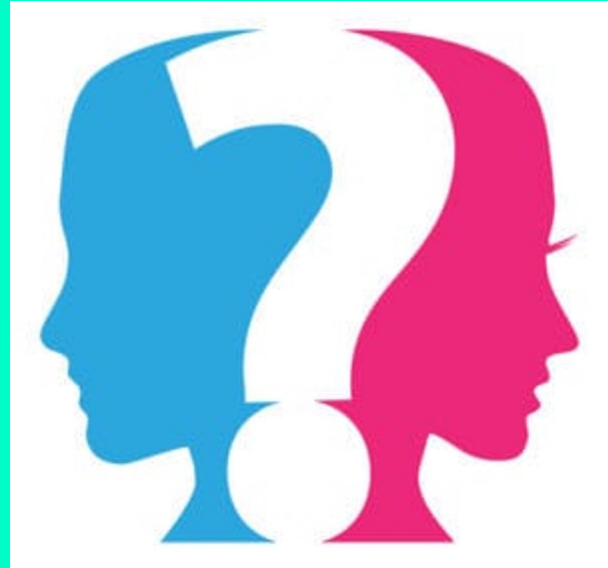

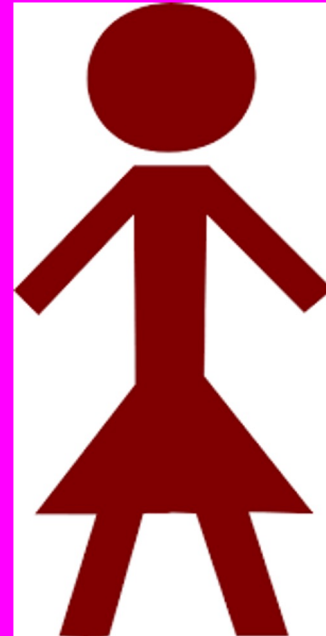

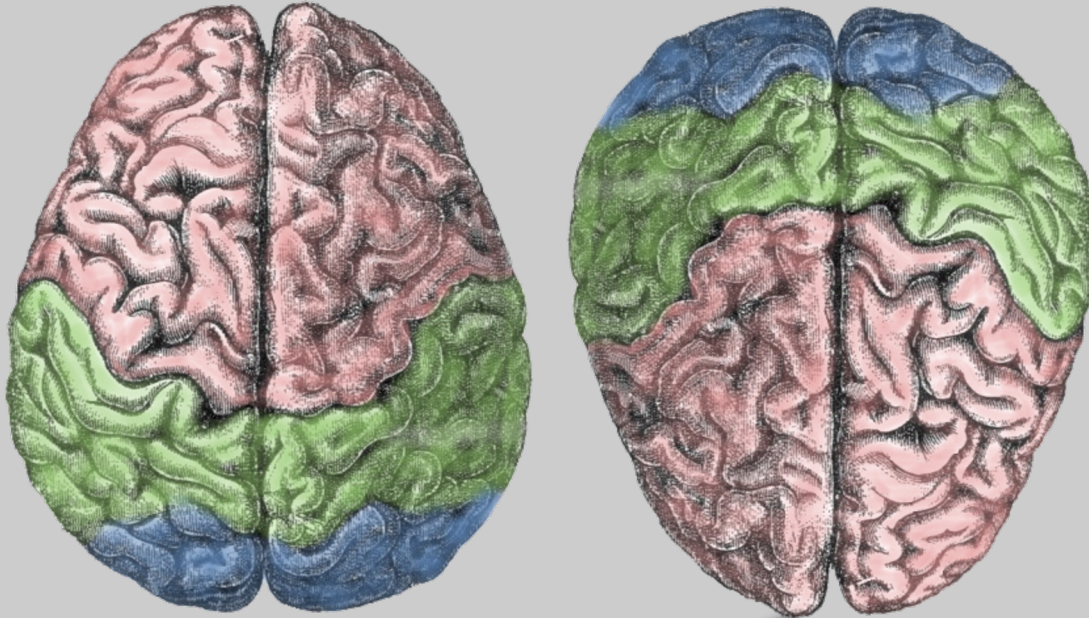

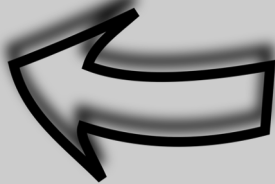

Gender identity is how you, in your head, think about yourself. It's the chemistry that composes you (e.g., hormonal levels) and how you interpret what that means.

Gender Expression

Feminine

Androgynous

Masculine

Gender expression is how you demonstrate your gender (based on traditional gender roles) through the ways you act, dress, behave, and interact.

Biological Sex

Female

Intersex

Male

Biological sex refers to the objectively measurable organs, hormones, and chromosomes. Female = vagina, ovaries, XX chromosomes; male = penis, testes, XY chromosomes; intersex = a combination of the two.

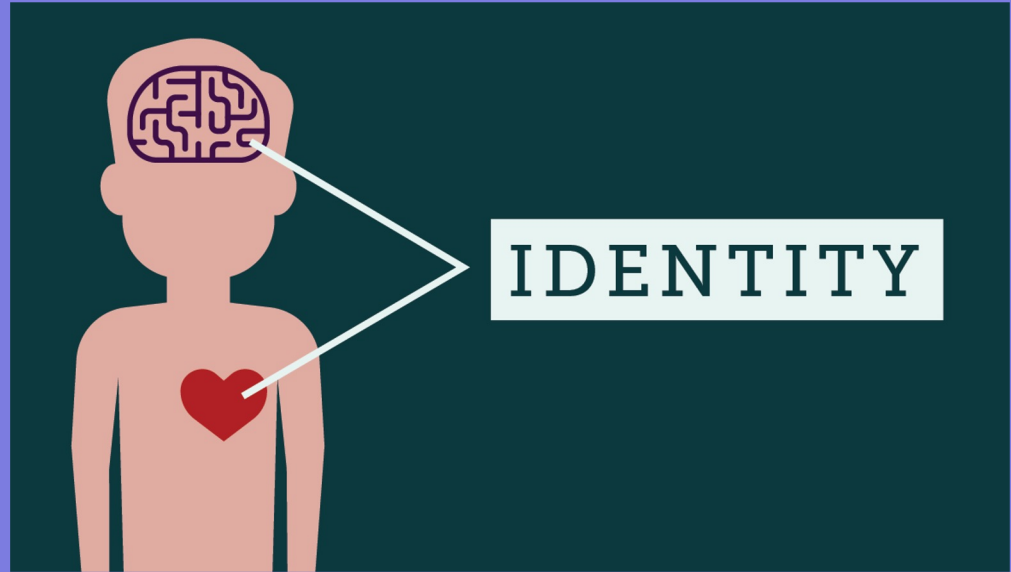
Sexual orientation is who you are physically, spiritually, and emotionally attracted to, based on their sex/gender in relation to your own.

LGBTQIA+

Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer or Questioning, Intersex, & Asexual

+ symbol indicates all others not included in acronym

GENDER IDENTITY



Gender Identity

Internal perception of one's gender -
how someone label themselves

Examples: man, woman, trans

Intersex

Person born with anatomy that doesn't fit
typical female or male

Example, female on the outside, but have
mostly male-typical anatomy on the inside

Gender Binary

Idea that there are only two genders (male and female) and every person fits into one or the other

Agender

Someone who sees themselves as existing without a gender

Bigender

Person who fluctuates between traditional “male” and “female” gender-based behavior and identities

Identify with both genders

Cisgender

Identity with the gender they were assigned at birth

Example: person born with male genitals who identifies as a male

Transgender

“Trans” - cross

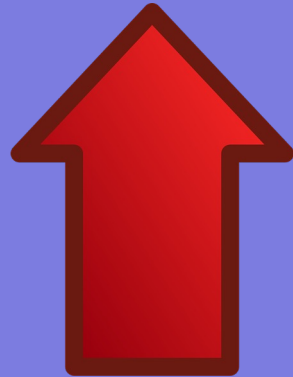
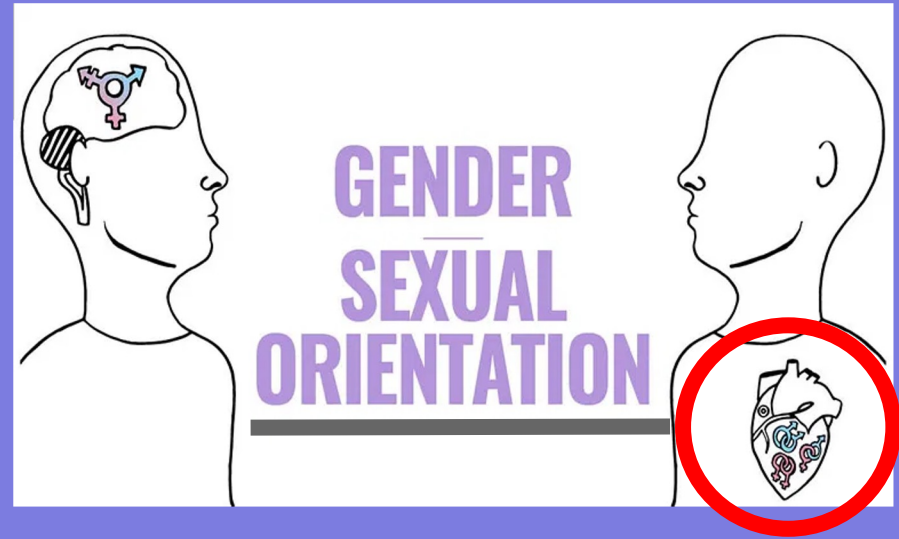
Gender identity is different from what person was assigned at birth

Gender fluid

Person lives between and around gender

Mix of things = person could feel male, female, both, neither

SEXUAL ORIENTATION



Sexual Orientation

Gender relationship between a person and the people they are attracted to

Asexual

Absence of sexual attraction

Can vary from no sexual attraction or any desire of sex to low levels of attraction or under certain conditions

Bisexual

“Bi” = 2

Person's attraction to 2 genders
(male and female)

Demisexual

“Demi” = half

Little capacity to experience sexual
attraction until strong romantic or
emotional connection is formed

Pansexual

“Pan” = all-inclusive

Person’s attraction to multiple genders

Queer

Adjective describing that sexual orientation is not exclusively heterosexual

Considered hateful when used by those who do not identify as LGBTQIA+
